The Art of Dying Well

On March 27th Bookshop Santa Cruz and Hospice of Santa Cruz County sponsored a talk and book signing by Katy Butler whose new book is titled "The Art of Dying Well."

Over 200 people attended. Katy stressed the importance of having agency in determining how we live the last years of our lives. Our flawed medical system often rewards physicians for ordering and prescribing life-prolonging treatments and many people believe that they have no choice but to accept the recommendations of these "experts."

Each of us must decide on the path which is right for us based on the quality of life we wish to have. Palliative care is finally coming into its own and may be a viable option for many. Katy described some very moving rituals which people have developed to honor the person who is dying.

She has a Facebook page called "slow death" which she invited people to join. Hospice of Santa Cruz County has a number of programs which may be helpful as we deal with the challenges of aging and dying. https://www.hospicesantacruz.org/
