YANA Comes to the City of Santa Cruz

Being alone and isolated is a reality for many older adults. The Santa Cruz Police Department 'You Are Not Alone' (YANA) program is a FREE service that allows older and/or disabled adults to have comfort and security in the knowledge that someone is checking in on them on a regular basis.

YANA Volunteers make regular contact with participants both by phone and with home visits. YANA is an excellent resource for seniors who enjoy living independently, but do not have friends or family available to regularly check in on them.

To qualify for the program you must be a resident of the City of Santa Cruz, be able to answer the phone, and provide at least one emergency contact.

'Dementia Reimagined' Asks: Can There Be
Happiness For Those With Memory Loss?

The California Hospital and Family Caregiver Law (our state's CARE ACT) helps family caregivers when their loved ones go into the hospital and as they transition home. The law requires hospitals to: Provide patients the opportunity to designate a family caregiver when admitted, keep that caregiver informed of their loved one's discharge plans, provide education and instruction, when appropriate, of aftercare tasks—such as medication management, injections, wound care, and transfers—that the family caregiver will perform at home.
