Why is it so hard to ask for help?

Recently, I arranged for my garden to be worked on as a project by other Village members. Now for me, this was daunting. It wasn't having people over, or coming up with the projects, or cooking for 8. No, it was just the simple act of asking for help. And because it has been almost impossible for me to say in all aspects of my life, that I need assistance, I stopped and wondered why. So I did some soul searching and reading about this difficulty. I found I'm not alone at all. In my readings, I found there were three aspects of why asking for help is so hard. A lot of it does go back to early learning: While you were growing up what kind of messages did you get about asking for help? Did your family place more value on "doing it yourself" or "letting others in?" When you did attempt to reach out in childhood, how did the people in your life respond? "Those few questions can shed a lot of light on whether you go through life overly self-reliant or feel comfortable turning to others for guidance, feedback, support, or comfort. If the messages you got, overtly or covertly, taught you that reaching out was unacceptable, futile, or would cause more pain, it makes sense that you would go it alone whenever possible. Through their own actions, family members modeled whether or not asking for help was acceptable. They also taught you the extent to which outsiders could be trusted resources. And most importantly, your past experiences with family, teachers, peers, and other significant people in your life served to either reinforce the notion that help was available, consistent, predictable and safe, or left you with the painful impression that your needs would go unheard and unanswered." 1
